

## Check with your neighbours

Always make sure your neighbours are happy with installing a fence extension, relay the heigh that you're wanting to install so all parties are satisfied with the extensions.

There may be some height restrictions in your local area also which you can check with your local council member.


## Measure Your Fence

We will need to know the length of your fence so we can make sure we make the correct number of extensions.

We make extensions in 2400mm sections, and can cut extensions down to size to fit the left over space.

To work out the length you need, find the length in meters, then divide by 2.4

eg: 6m long fence  $6000 \div 2400 = 2.5$ 2 full fence extensions + 1 cut down to 1200mm in length

## **Attach Your Fence Extension**

Slip the legs on top of the fence, having the long leg sitting on the flat side of the fence and the shorter leg sitting on the rail side.

\*Let us know if you have capping on your fence as we will adjust the legs accordingly\*

Screw through the legs onto the fence using galvanised screws.

## Match Up Remaining Extensions

Attach the remaining fence extensions to the fence, butting them up against each other for a seamless finish

Best way to screw the screens onto your fence is to use a power drill. We recommend an impact driver.
